## INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Tweedy, Browne International Value Fund invests primarily in foreign equity securities that the Adviser believes are undervalued, but also invests on a more limited basis in US equity securities when opportunities appear attractive. Investments by the Fund are focused for the most part in developed markets with some exposure to emerging markets. The Fund seeks to reduce currency risk by hedging its perceived foreign currency exposure back into the US dollar where practicable.

## COMMITMENT OF THE ADVISER

As of March 31, 2026, the current Managing Directors and retired principals and their families, as well as employees of Tweedy, Browne, had more than \$327.7 million invested in our Funds, including approximately \$194.1 million in the International Value Fund. Investment Committee members have spent between 10 and 52 years working at Tweedy, Browne. No Management Committee member has ever left the firm except for the reason of retirement.

- 2 The Fund does not impose any front-end or deferred sales charges. The expense ratios shown above reflect the inclusion of acquired fund fees and expenses (i.e., the fees and expenses attributable to investing cash balances in money market funds) and may differ from those shown in the Funds' financial statements.
- 3 Tweedy, Browne has voluntarily agreed, effective May 22, 2020 through at least July 31, 2026, to waive the Fund's fees whenever the Fund's average daily net assets ("ADNA") exceed \$6 billion. Under the arrangement, the advisory fee payable by the Fund is as follows: 1.25% on the first \$6 billion of the Fund's ADNA; 0.80% on the next \$1 billion of the Fund's ADNA (ADNA over \$6 billion up to \$7 billion); 0.70% on the next \$1 billion of the Fund's ADNA (ADNA over \$7 billion up to \$8 billion); and 0.60% on the remaining amount, if any, of the Fund's ADNA (ADNA over \$8 billion). The performance data shown above would have been lower had fees not been waived during certain periods.
- 4 The MSCI EAFE Index is free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed markets, excluding the US and Canada. The MSCI EAFE Index (Hedged to USD) consists of the results of the MSCI EAFE Index hedged 100% back into US dollars and accounts for interest rate differentials in forward currency exchange rates.
